

FERNANDA GALVÃO 1994, São Paulo/SP. Lives and works in São Paulo/SP.

From the landscapes, the invented places, described and later imagined by science fiction readers, to the extravagances of the art direction and the misfortunes of cancer cells, Fernanda Galvão builds her work. Paying attention to the viscosities, colors and histories of her surroundings, she invents and reinvents the places she would like to inhabit.

Herpictorial practice presents a glossary of painting forms, gestures and procedures that are combined in different ways and that present specific and dense atmospheres.

Sometimes earthy and hot, sometimes watery and cool. Above all, ambiguous, in terms of the relation of scale between what is seen painted and what is experienced outside the "picture", if there is such a distinction, are her paintings representations of places or are they places themselves? Or yet, could we inhabit these places or are they the ones who inhabit our space? "Mata II" (*Forest II*) and "Travessia" (*Crossing*) show clippings, parts of these places, and what we can learn by looking at them is that their coherence and their rules are not equivalent to ours. This relationship in the "Gota" (*Drop*) video is also of the

order of manipulation. To the records of situations that she spontaneously encountered, the artist combines records of situations she has forged. By joining constructions and editions with documents relating to nature's relations, the artist hinders the understanding of the natural and the artificial, but just enough to make us doubt the very naturalness of nature.




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
